Following years of absence, Russia is again a key diplomatic and security player in Southeast Europe. Its vocal opposition to the expansion of NATO and even the EU in the Western Balkans has turned it into an ally for some and existential threat for others in the region. Moscow's presence and influence in Serbia, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina and in Macedonia have generated a flurry of journalist articles and think tank reports. Russia's footprint in the energy sector in a number of countries is a subject of heated discussions. Political and economic relations between Russia and Turkey, going through several dramatic turnarounds over the past three-four years, have large impact on the wider region of Southeast Europe too. Remarkably, Russian activities and interest are falling on fertile ground among certain Balkan politicians as well. They use Russia for their own interests and as a bargaining chip vis-a-vis the West. The conference convened by Südosteuropa-Gesellschaft takes stock of Russia's strategy and influence in the region as well as the response by

local actors and by the EU and the US. It gathers a group of distinguished experts from the EU, Russia as well as from the countries of the Western Balkans.

ATTENTION: The conference will take place under **Chatham House Rule** in order to facilitate an unrestricted and open exchange of views and ideas. At a meeting held under the Chatham House Rule, anyone who comes to the meeting is free to use information from the discussion but is not allowed to reveal who made any comment. It is designed to increase openness of discussion.
