Voraussetzungen

A first academic degree (usually a B.A. or equivalent or higher) in the humanities, the social sciences, economics, or law. The final or preliminary final grade of the first degree must be 2,5 or better according to the German grading system to be eligible to apply. Confirmed C1 level in English.

Mögliche Schwerpunkte

The programme is intended to be interdisciplinary, so there are no tracks to choose from, but students can develop a certain disciplinary focus through the classes they choose to attend, the Erasmus partner university they go to (if they opt to spend their third semester abroad), and their thesis topic.

Sprachkurseangebote

The only modularised language course is a German as a Foreign Language class that can be attended by students who do not go abroad on Erasmus in their third term. Apart from that, students are free to attend any of the language classes on offer by our ZSK (Centre for Language and Communication), but these do not count towards the degree programme.

Aufenthalte in Südosteuropa

Students have the option of going abroad on an Erasmus term in their third semester. Some of the MA European Studies' partner institutions are located in or bordering Southeast Europe, e.g. Alexandru Ioan Cuza University in Iași, Romania, Panteion University in Athens, Greece, the University of Ljubljana and the University of Pécs. Student who don't go on Erasmus must complete an internship of at least six weeks in a company or organisation of their choice. This can take place anywhere, so could of course be completed in a Southeast European country as well.

Besonderheiten des Standorts

The MA European Studies at Regensburg University is an interdisciplinary and international programme, entirely taught in English and with the option of spending a semester abroad at one of our many partner institutions. Almost 90% of our students are internationals from all over the world, so studying this degree is a truly intercultural experience. The programme provides a thorough understanding of Europe not only as an actor in an increasingly globalised world, but also as a transnational community. Students approach Europe from a multidisciplinary perspective through the areas of law and economics, history and social sciences, and literary- as well as cultural studies.
